Two incumbents file for two open village board seats

Incumbents Randy Robeson and Steve Hummel have filed for the two open seats on the Brainard Village Board, according to the Butler County Clerk's office. No one else has filed and all filing deadlines are now past.

Four have filed for three open seats on the East Butler Board of Education, including Laurie Smaus and incumbent Kimberly TePoel, North Ward; incumbent Megan Kozisek, Middle Ward; and incumbent Brandon Jisa, South Ward. Deadlines have passed to file for school board seats.

Voting for seats open on the East Butler Board of Education and Brainard Village Board will be held at the general election in the fall. For more information, contact the county clerk's office.

All blood types are needed to ensure a reliable supply for patients. A blood donor card or driver's license or two other forms of identification are required at checkin. Individuals who are 17 years of age (or 16 with parental consent in some areas), weigh at least 110 pounds and are in generally good health may be eligible to donate blood.
