The Brainard Village Pool Renovation Committee recently met with Waters Edge Aquatic Design to review preliminary options for updating the community's existing pool. Representatives from the design company presented several renovation possibilities tailored to the current pool layout and shared valuable insight based on their experience with similar projects.

"It was interesting to see the process and hear his thoughts on what might work best for our community," said Karla Wall, a committee member. "We're now taking time to carefully weigh the options."
